The Vicar Writes



In our Gospel today Jesus appeared in a locked room to his disciples in his spiritual form. His body was able to appear and disappear and was thus transcendental to mundane material laws that ordinarily restrict embodied souls. The soul is different from the physical body in that it is eternal whereas the body is temporary. The physical body is a gift of the Lord to the soul so that we may use it in God's service and develop our

spiritual lives through prayer, service and contemplation. The spiritual body is the body that is eternal, full of knowledge and bliss and is meant for the eternal service of the lord. The spiritual body is our very self, is a part of God's Spirit and is free from any defects or pollution.

After showing himself to the disciples the Lord showed his hands and side to convince them it was he and they were not merely seeing an apparition. The Lord then gave them the Holy Spirit by breathing on them. This conforms with the words of the Creed that the Holy Spirit proceeds both from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit is the power of God and the inner guide of all souls usually perceived as conscience. That Holy Spirit is the very life force within all of us. Not everyone however is aware of the presence of God's guiding Spirit within them, they don't realise that the dearest beloved friend of their soul is closer than their heart beat, behind every breath they take. Jesus made his intimate disciples aware of this divine presence within them simply by breathing on them. How fortunate for them, we too can have this awakening by developing an awareness that it is the Lord's breathing life into us at every moment. God is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning, middle and end of all beings.

Our lives would stand to benefit so much if we could accept these things and practice the presence of God in our lives. Doubting Thomas had to see everything to believe, but the Lord said blessed are those who believe without seeing. Hearing is in fact the sense most able to perceive Spirit, not the sense of seeing. The sound of the breath is spiritual if we understand that it is the Lord who breathes in us, the disciples heard the Holy Spirit at Pentecost as the sound of a rushing wind, scripture or any written word is heard even in the mind when read and so it is by hearing that we increase our perception of God and increase our faith. Jesus didn't encourage blind believing but he did set us on the path to true discovery by encouraging us to listen for the Spirit and be open to God's presence, love and guidance in our lives.
