

The Vicar Writes



The Lord makes a strong stand against minimalist ideas regarding worship. Mary, the sister of Lazarus, began to worship the Lord by anointing the feet of Jesus with oil and then wiped them with her own hair. Judas Iscariot objected saying the oil could be sold and the money given to the poor. The statement of the Lord that Mary's service was valid and the poor you will always have with you is very significant.

We are not servants of the poor exclusively. We are exclusively servants of God who is present in all hearts. There is nothing wrong with serving the poor, but without God consciousness no

service has lasting value. Everything in this world is temporary. Therefore, merely serving things of this world without the consciousness of God will help in a temporary way, but the effect of that service will fade away into oblivion.

God is the Supreme eternal amongst all eternals and, therefore, it is the Lord whom we serve. When you water the roots of a tree the whole tree is nourished. If you only water the leaves the tree will wither and die. A person of spiritual vision sees the object of love. God equally present everywhere and, therefore, they will honour all creatures with respect and affection, not just the ones that agree with them or are of the same economic and social status. Nor will they honour the poor more than the rich or vice versa.

The servant of the Lord serves the Lord in whatever situation the Lord puts them in. They will see themselves as the servant of everyone and see no one as their inferior.

Judas objected to the worship of Christ in the same way that some people object to the worship of Christ in the Eucharist, or in the same way that some people think that nice buildings should not be constructed for worship because the money could be used for the poor. The truth is everyone, rich and poor, benefit by worshipping the Lord. The life of us all becomes auspicious by our service to, and worship of, the Lord, and so a minimalist attitude is inauspicious. As the Lord said to the Pharisees, they would only see him when they learn to say blessed is he comes in the name of the Lord; the same applies to everyone. We have to get over the tendency to begrudge service to God.

Service to God is utilitarian; it is not based on what's good for the majority of people, nor is it based on what's good for us. Service to God is the highest welfare for all souls at all times, it is eternal and joyfully performed. Devotional service is joyfully performed because it is that action, performed in full awareness of the presence of God in all hearts, is saturated with love. From remembering the Lord all other kinds of service follow, such as a worship, prayer or acts of kindness. From this service all fruits of the Spirit flower in a person and it may be performed by anyone. All kinds of devotional service to God are beneficial and, if one is unable to render physical service, simply remembering the Lord will suffice, for from such remembrance of love for God and neighbour as self will grow.

The message is, never begrudge service to God. Perform devotional service yourself and encourage others in their path, allowing God, the greatest teacher of all, to lead them.
