


ABM REFLECTION

If we take just one sentence from each of the readings for today, we have a glimpse into part of what is expected of a Christian. Firstly, the Psalm reminds us, 'he has done marvellous things.' - a reminder that it is God who does the miracles. But we can play our part. Job says, 'I delivered the poor who cried, and the orphan who had no helper.' - our duty to those in physical need.

Those in Antioch remind us of our duty of giving to those in need, 'each would send relief to the believers living in Judea.' And finally from Jesus himself, 'proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.' Do we need any further reminders of what we should be doing?

- Pray for those in need and those who are making a special effort to assist them.
- Give thanks for the Episcopal Church of South Sudan and Sudan, and pray for peace between and within both countries.
